### **FAST & ABSTINENCE**

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Members of the Eastern Catholic Churches are to observe the particular law of their own *sui iuris* Church.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Brooke graduated from St. Joseph's in 1995 and continued her high school education at Yoakum High. After graduation, Brooke attended college and earned a medical degree from Texas A&M Health Science Center. She completed her residency training in Obstetrics and Gynecology at Mercy Hospital in St. Louis, Missouri and is one of only a handful of fellowship-trained NaPro Technology surgeons in the United States. Dr. Jemelka is a member of the American Academy of Fertility Care Professionals, American Association of Gynecologic Laparoscopists, International Institute of Restorative Reproductive Medicine, American Congress of Obstetrics and Gynecology, and the Catholic Medical Association. Dr. Jemelka is currently a member of the medical staff of St. Luke's Medical Group Caritas Women's Care in Sugar Land, Texas. Dr. Jemelka has taken her Catholic foundation and teaching and has carried it with her in her profession. She is an example of doing the right thing when it may not be the easy thing. She is an example of what it means to walk in the footsteps of Christ by living her faith through her medical career. She is an advocate for Natural Family Planning and for all Catholic teachings in dealings with women's reproductive systems and rights.
