Cemetery News

In the last month an effort has been made to remind parishioners who have purchased and/or reserved plots at the cemetery to contact the parish office and begin making payments/installments on the spaces chosen. It is not an issue of wanting to add to a family's worries and concerns—rather—many of these are from the last 5 years (some older) and not simply recent deaths/burials. And in many of these cases, at the time of choosing their loved one's plot, they also chose and reserved other spaces for other family members. If the families who have received these notices would at least contact the office and inform us about setting up a minimal payment schedule all will be fine. But after two attempts of contacting (last one being certified mail)...if we do not hear back from anyone, those spaces "reserved" but that have not had any payment plan setup, will be considered unwanted and will be made available again to others who express interest. A cemetery is certainly not a "money-maker," as its annual costs far surpass its very meager income. Annual operating expenses at our cemetery run approximately \$19,000 including maintenance, utilities, supplies and property insurance. Therefore, we need to show responsibility in maintaining our cemetery as dignified consecrated ground—and those who are utilizing it for this purpose, must exercise that same responsibility.

All Souls Remembrance

For those who would like to have an All Souls Day envelope, extras may be found in the entrance areas of the Church. These will remain on the Altar for the novena of Masses for the Faithful Departed as well as during the month of November (month of the Holy Souls).
