## Cemetery Regulations Update

It might seem odd that a cemetery has to have rules and regulations--and that they have to be updated. The reality is that such is the necessity. Most of us tend to think in terms of our grandparents, parents and sadly at times, our children who are laid to rest in this consecrated ground. It's easy to forget that generations have come and gone before us, and will come long after our time in this vale of tears. One need only to survey some of the older sections of the cemetery to see the condition of the markers and graves of those who have no family present in the parish to care for their loved one's plots--and the disrepair and damage the ensuing years have left. Such is the rationale for the latest update regarding the rules and regulations. Upkeep and expenses for St. Joseph Cemetery costs approximately \$16,000-18,000 a year. A major portion of this expense is carried by the parish each year as the Cemetery does not generate enough income to cover its own expenses. Thus one can see why there is a differentiation between registered parishioner and non-parishioner. We are very proud of the beauty of our cemetery--but it does pose challenges that we must meet. The pricing remains the same--the major change regards interring cremains in existing burial spaces. Due to record keeping, only one additional interment in a grave occupied by a casket can be made. We have an obligation for those future generations to document such additions as they are--properly speaking--doubling the grave space. The updated rules and regulations are available on the parish website, the cemetery database and through the parish office.
